He tells of his prison ministry and the street work that he has been involved in, as well as some stories of his escapades along the way. Also of a wife who has stood beside him through thick and thin and supported him completely as no other could.

Brother Norman says that they have also been in the nursing home ministry for 24 years and are involved in the Transport for Christ ministries helping truck drivers on their travels. They sing in restaurants, auctions and other places outside of the church. You see, your pulpit is wherever you are...



Because he is so dedicated to the furthering of the gospel and reaching lost souls, George Norman doesn't complain about his disability, he even cracks jokes about it!

The rest of us grumble and complain if we are called on to do anything at all. I know I'm guilty. "Uh, I'll have to pray about that... let me get back to you..." As Sister Luke so aptly describes that statement —
“BAAALONY!”

Brother Norman says “The truth is, you don't have to be a Super Star, just be obedient to the spirit of God to lift up Christ's name to see souls brought to Him.”

Indeed the harvest is ripe and the workers are few. How privileged we are to live in a country where we are free to attend services and be blessed of God so richly without fear of retribution.

The freedom that we all take so much for granted is not really free though. It cost many Americans their lives. May we all be so humble and willing to serve as Brother Norman while we go about our daily lives proclaiming God's love to a lost and dying world and remember that we can serve anywhere, anytime to be a light to a lost and dying world. Women's Ministries

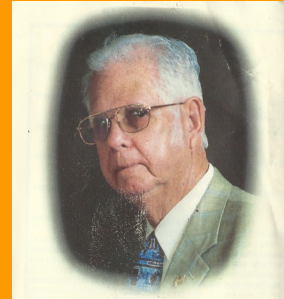
