I was invited to hear a friend minister. When I arrived, I realized I was overdressed. I began to look around and feel uncomfortable. There were men and women that looked pretty rough, as some people might say. Most had tattoos, some had Mohawks, and some had piercings on their face. You see, this was a service to minister to former and recovering drug addicts.

They opened the service with prayer requests and then a few worship songs. Then one by one they began to share testimonies.

As I sat there, my eyes were opened. The Holy Spirit really began to deal with me and show me that I was wrong for feeling awkward and uncomfortable. I was judging them by their outward appearance. This wasn't the kind of Christians that I was used to seeing; I felt as if maybe I shouldn't be there. Again, I was wrong...

The Lord showed me that this was what ministry and the love of God is really about. Just because people have done things that I would never do, or wear things I would never wear doesn't mean that they are less than me. God loves them the same. They may not speak the way I speak or be as sanctified in my eyes, but they are God's and who am I to judge?

I sat back and began to be transformed and renewed as I saw the zeal and passion for God that came from these men and women. Their worship to God was done in truth. They weren't ashamed to lift their hands or fall on their face before God. There was a hunger within them. It was as if they hung on every word that was spoken or sang.

As they began to share their testimonies, I was amazed. These people were heavy drug users, thieves, and those abandoned by their parents.

One man described how he had tried many religions, even satanic worship. Only one month prior to this meeting, he was a priest in another false religion. Another spoke about how he carried the casket of his 18 year old friend. He felt responsible for his death because they both did drugs one night, and his friend overdosed.

I was reminded of the woman with the Alabaster box. She poured out everything to the Master. It didn't matter that others looked down on her. She lay at His feet and worshipped. She did it because she had been set free. It cost her everything.

You see, that's what these former addicts were experiencing. For the first time in their lives, they felt free! *They met Jesus.* He had delivered them from their bondage and forgiven their sins. He had covered the shame that they have carried for so long. And now, they are passionate for God and don't care what others think because they know where He has brought them from.



My prayer is that I never forget God's love. Lord love through me. Let me not hinder your work. Don't let me look down on others because they may be different. Help me to keep the fire lit within me like I see in these men and women. Holy Spirit let your blaze burn bright.


When it becomes hard in this land, take hold of your shield of faith and extend it. As you do, it will activate all the other pieces of the armor.
